1.0 Cycling

1.1 The **Travel to Work loan scheme**

Different to the Cycle to Work scheme, which is a national initiative, this University scheme could help you buy a bicycle and associated safety equipment with an interest-free loan of up to £2,500. There is a form to download and fill in, then send to the University's central Payroll team. Full details are online: cambens-employee-benefits/travel/travel-work-loan

1.2 The Cycle to Work scheme

This scheme also allows staff to purchase bicycles and associated safety equipment on a tax-free basis through a salary sacrifice repayment process. Staff can select any model of bike up to a value of £2,000 through local bike shops taking part in this scheme. There is a multi-stage process involving finding a quote and then requesting a certificate online. Full details are online: employee-benefits/travel/cambens-cycle-work-scheme

1.5 Stay safe, and keep your bike secure!

Bike security is a really important issue in Cambridge, where so many cycles are stolen each year. It's a good idea to register your bike for free at www.immobilise.com. This is recommended by the police. Also check your home insurance and consider extending it if necessary. When you leave your bike, make sure your bike is locked to something secure and that the lock goes through the frame and any quick-release parts of the bike if possible.

1.6 Drive part-way, then use the Park & Cycle

Even if you drive into work, you can still use your bike to get around town with the Park & Cycle facility on Clerk Maxwell Road, off Madingley Road...

2.0 Park & Cycle

Did you know about... Secure overnight storage for your bike so that you can avoid the city centre traffic

This secure storage facility for your bike and related equipment means that you can avoid the city centre traffic.

Available to all city centre-based University of Cambridge staff, it works in the same way as a Park & Ride but with bikes! Essentially a user can drive to the Park & Cycle area on Madingley Road, park their car, take out their bike from an individual locker and cycle the rest of the way to work. Waterproof clothing and cycle helmets etc. could also be stored in the lockers.

It is not compulsory to cycle. Staff can still use the facility if they wish to jog, walk or take the subsidised Uni 4 bus to complete their journey.

Cars cannot be left overnight except by prior arrangement.

3.0 Buses

Did you know about... Subsidised travel on the Uni 4; Cambridgeshire bus services; Park & Ride information.

3.1 Uni 4 subsidy

The University subsidises the **Uni 4 bus service**, which runs between the Madingley Road Park & Ride site and the Cambridge Biomedical Campus (Addenbrooke's Hospital). See timetable and route online for details: bus_timetable_directory_record.aspx?R=CB-UNI4

Show your University Card for a discounted rate on the Uni 4 (available to all staff, students, and other University Card holders). There is currently no stop at the Railway Station. The closest stop to the Station is currently at the top of Brooklands Avenue and the closest stop to the Sidgwick Site is West Road.

5.0 Train

Do you know how to access... 10% discounts on monthly/ annual season tickets for specific routes.

A 10% discount rate on the purchase of train season tickets and bulk-buy tickets is available for staff of the University of Cambridge.

Scheme summary:

- A discount rate of 10% will apply to season tickets purchased for travel for work between a selection of Greater Anglia or First Capital Connect stations (excluding London Kings Cross) to Cambridge, Ely, St Neots or Huntingdon stations.
- A 10% discount is also available on a 'bulk buy' ticket option from National Express East Anglia, for occasional travel to work by train. Twenty tickets can be purchased for use within a 3month period. See full information document below for more details.
- Tickets can be purchased online, at selected stations and by phone.
