I've chatted to some people already about how they think things could be done differently, and we've got some suggestions:

- Give lecturers the ability to teach (optional) extension classes/practicals, if they and the students all agree they want more contact time
- Have a faster-paced Part I for Linguistics in particular
- Have fewer overview lectures and introductory assignments at the beginning of the course, with a small amount more preliminary reading; so the lectures can quickly get onto more interesting topics (which is, after all, why we're here)
- Make course information and materials available publicly on the website, as it
 used to be, rather than hidden away in an opaque private file-sharing system like
 Moodle
- Make exam scripts from all MML and Linguistics papers available to students via a Freedom of Information request, as the examiners' notes currently are; so we can keep our own work for personal reference
- Encourage all courses to save the trees and go paper-free whenever possible, perhaps by emailing PDFs of handouts before lectures and classes or putting them online
