————— L^AT_EX GUIDELINES —————

We strongly encourage authors to submit their manuscripts in `.tex` (L^AT_EX) format with a separate `.bib` file containing the bibliography. Following are some general guidelines:

1. Acknowledgements footnotes should go on the heading of the first section (usually the introduction).
2. For numbers examples, we recommend the `expex` package. Judgment marks at the start of an example should use `\ljudge`;
e.g. `\ex \ljudge* This grammatical isn't.\xe`
3. Section headings/titles: in general, capitalise only the first word.
4. For tables with a lot of text we recommend the `tabulary` package.
5. Captions on tables should end in full stop. Leave out vertical lines for tables (unless absolutely necessary). For empty cells, use a single solid line `-`.
6. Use single quotes ‘ ’ rather than double “ ”.
7. For references, use the `natbib` package.

For the `.bib` file:

8. Capitalise the initial letter of every content word for book/journal/collection/etc. titles. Only capitalise the first word for article/thesis/presentation/etc. titles.
9. Enclose non-entry-initial capitalised letters in brackets ,
e.g. `booktitle = ‘‘Structure and {B}eyond’’`.
10. Use en-dash (two hyphens) in page numbers,
e.g. `pages = 104 -- 131`.
11. Citation key format: author’s last name + four-digit year, e.g. `Chomsky2004`. If there are two authors, include both last names, e.g. `DixonAikhenvald2000`. If there are multiple authors, only include the first author’s last name followed by ‘`Etal`’,
e.g. `BadawiEtal2004`.
12. For underline/underscore inside URL use a backslash,
e.g. `http://www.ling.cam.ac.uk/COPIL/COPiL/Resources/COPiL.Call.2020.pdf`
